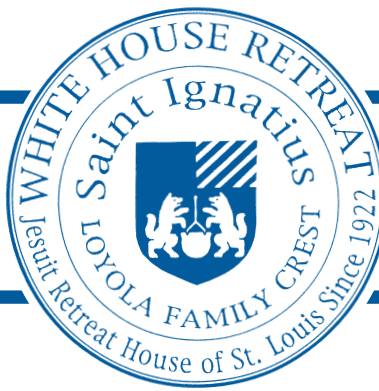

ADVENT PRAYER DAYS

For the fourth year White House Retreat will be offering two Advent Days of Prayer. During the last three years these days have been very popular with retreatants and have introduced new people to White House.

Fr. Edward O'Brien, S.J., will lead the **Day of Prayer** which will be offered twice: **Monday, December 8 and Tuesday, December 16**. Check-in starts at 8:30 am. The program will begin at 9:15 a.m. and end by 2:30 p.m. Each day will consist of two morning reflections on an Advent and Christmas theme, lunch, an afternoon reflection and a closing Eucharist. Priests will be available during the day for those who would like to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation in preparation for Christmas.

The day of prayer is for both men and women, so it provides a great opportunity for a couple to attend together. Please try to get a group of friends



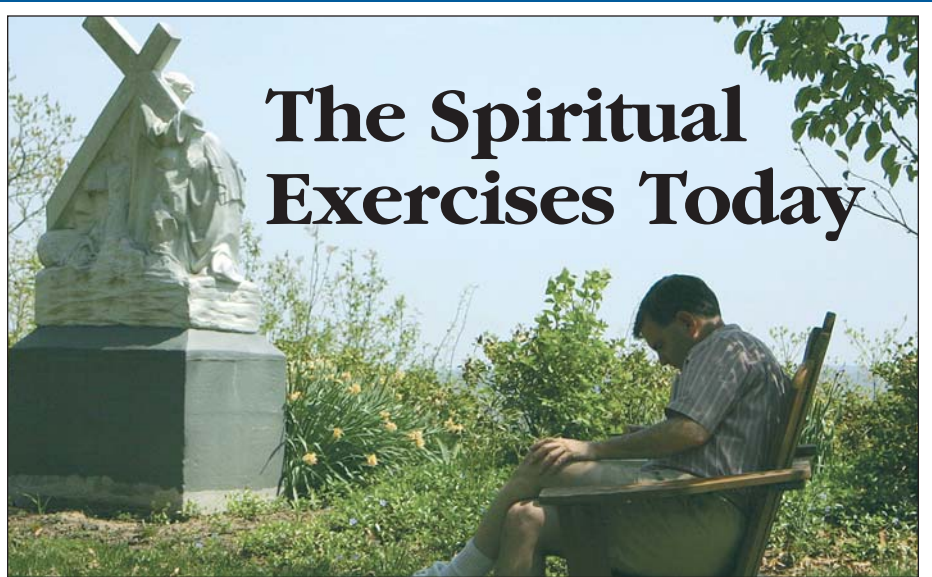
or parishioners to attend! The same theme will be presented both days for the convenience of people who find it easier to come on a particular day. December 8th is the Feast of The Immaculate Conception.

The Spiritual Exercises Today

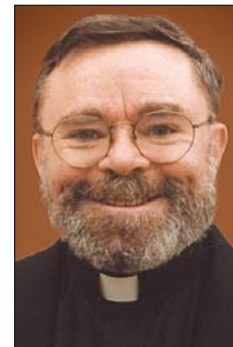
The importance of the mission of White House, the giving of The Spiritual Exercises, was confirmed and emphasized at the General Congregation of the Society of Jesus which was held in Rome from January to March, 2008. The following quote is from the decree: **Challenges To Our Mission Today: Sent To The Frontiers.**

The rapid pace of cultural change has been accompanied by an interior emptiness as well as a new interest in popular religiosity, a renewed search for meaning, and a thirst for a spiritual experience often sought outside institutional religion. The Spiritual Exercises, which from the start have been a precious instrument in our hands, are today of invaluable assistance to many of our contemporaries. They help us to initiate and to progress in a life of prayer, to search for and to find God in all things, and to discern his will, making faith more personal and more incarnate. Our contemporaries are also helped in the difficult task of feeling a deeper sense of integration in their lives; the experience of the Exercises helps them achieve this by entering into a dialogue with God in freedom. We encourage Jesuits to give the Spiritual Exercises, "to allow the Creator to deal immediately with the creature and the creature with its Creator and Lord" to lead people to a deeper relationship with God in Christ and through that relationship to service of his Kingdom.
